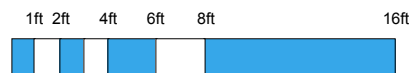
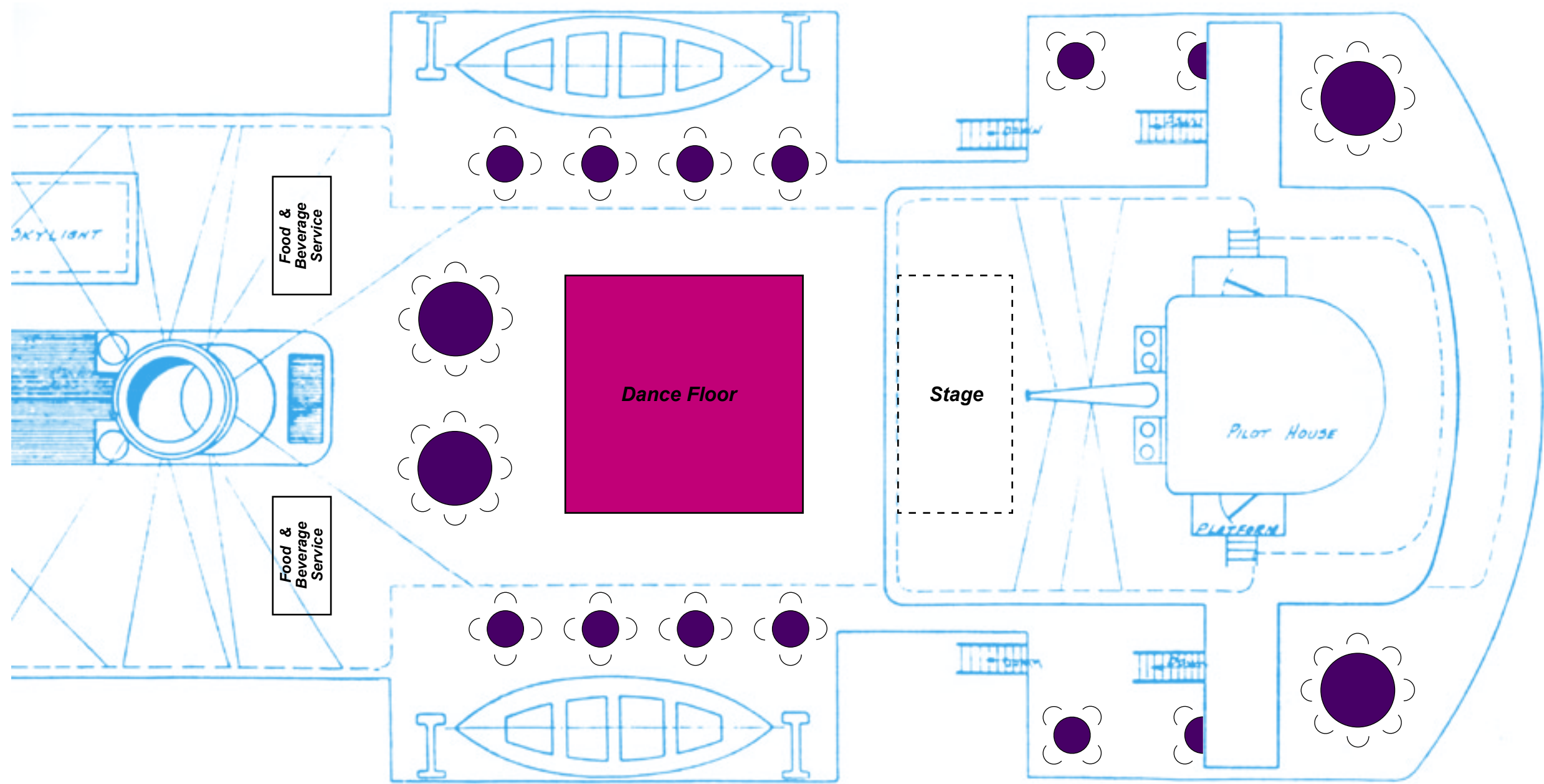


# Forward Decks: Dance/Seating Plan

**Total seating: 160+ persons**

The solid railing on the bow and the towering superstructure create an amphitheater like setting. This area is ideal for wedding ceremonies and outdoor presentations. Use of the forward superstructure deck areas allows for interesting variations with seating and stage options.

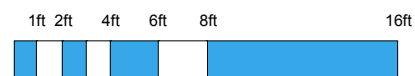


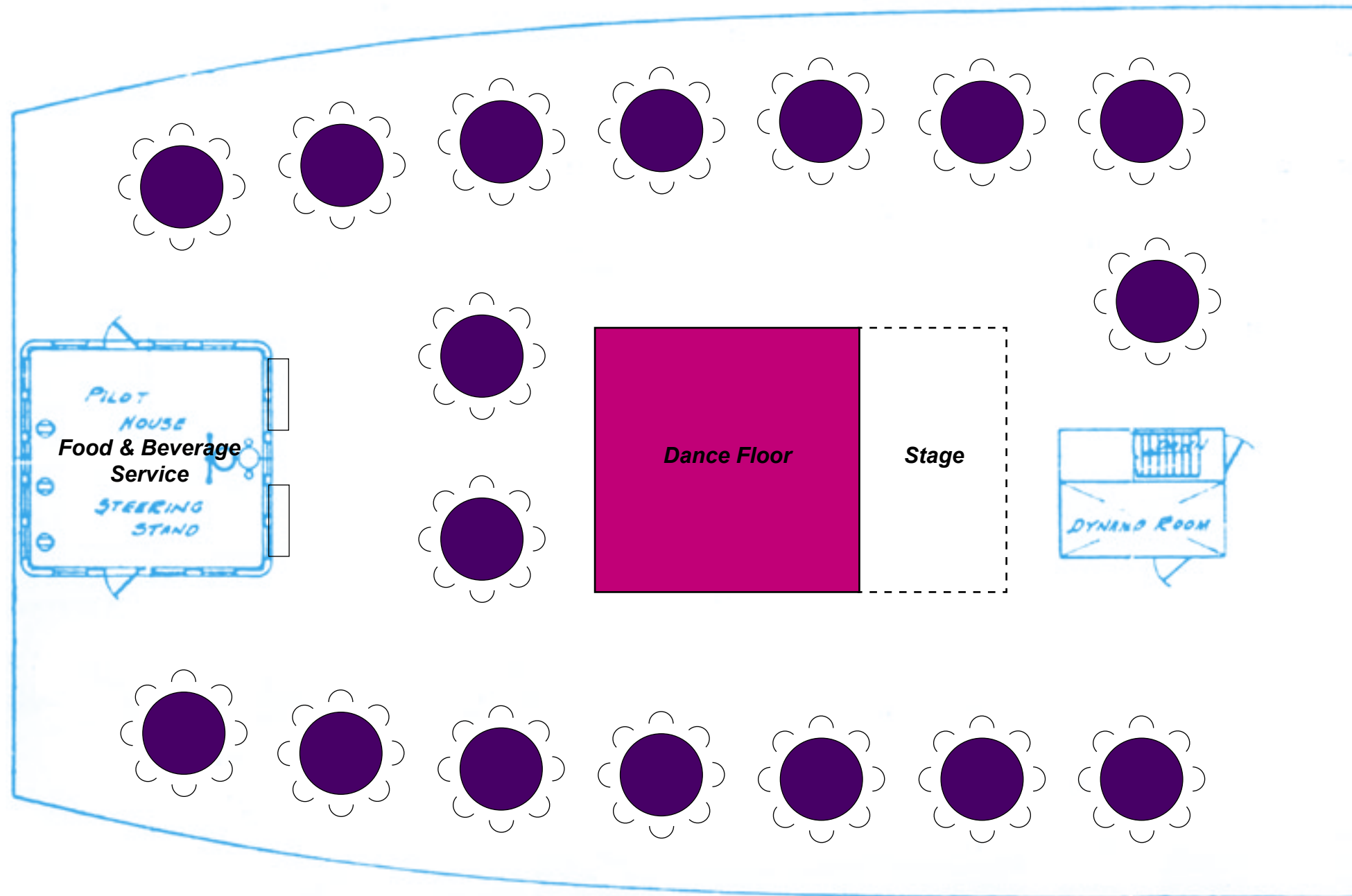


# Lifeboat Deck: Dance/Seating Plan

**Total seating: 80+ persons**

One of the highest decks on the ship, it offers stunning views and a dramatic sense of place with the smoke stacks, masts and lifeboats encircling. The Texas Deck, Captains Promenade and Bridge Wings allow for interesting variations with seating and stage options. (Note: access to this area requires use of steep stairs).

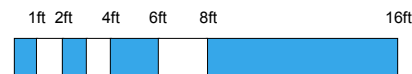


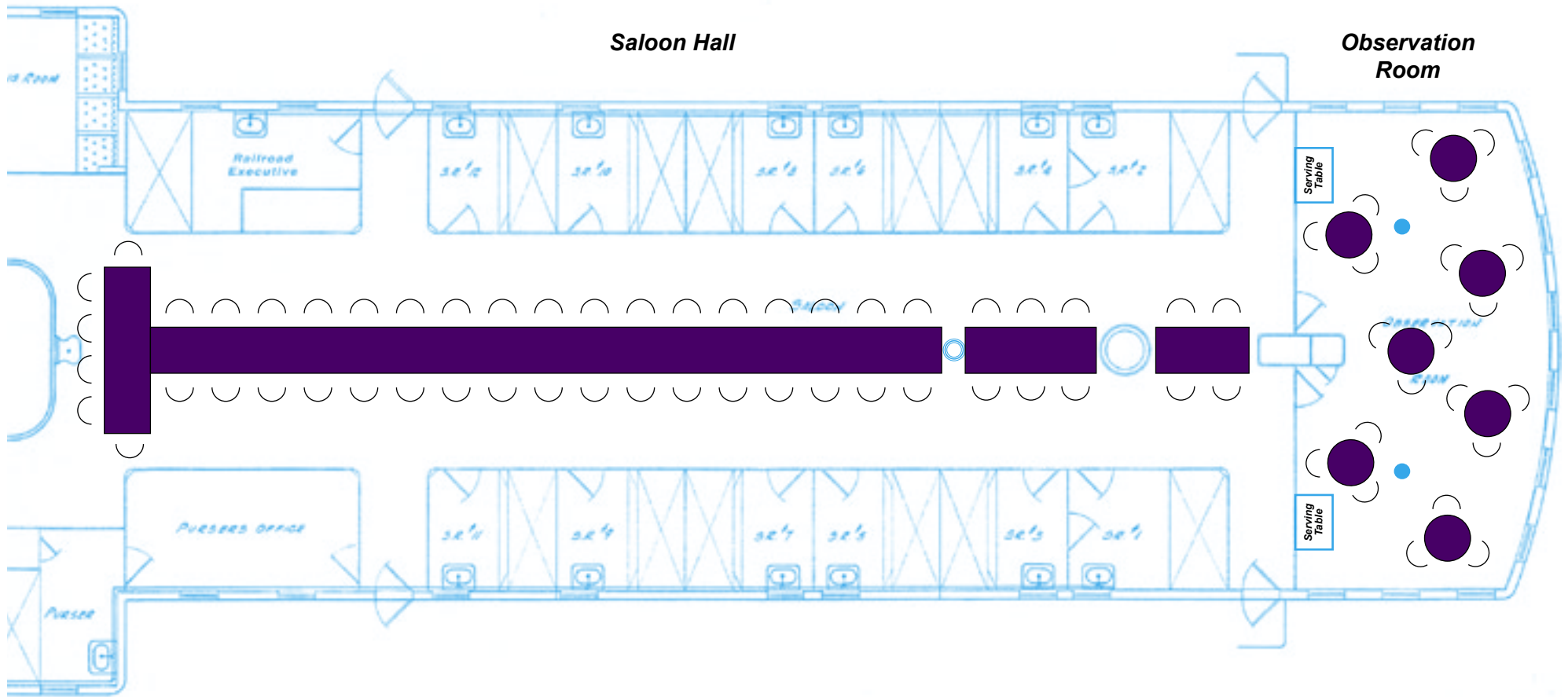


# Weather Deck Aft: Dance/Seating Plan

**Total seating: 136+ persons**

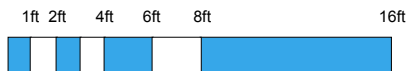
The Aft Weather Deck is to be fitted with a canopy and clear side curtains in the near future, providing an “all weather” events area. The open pipe railings allow for a nearly 360 degree unobstructed view, even when guests are seated.



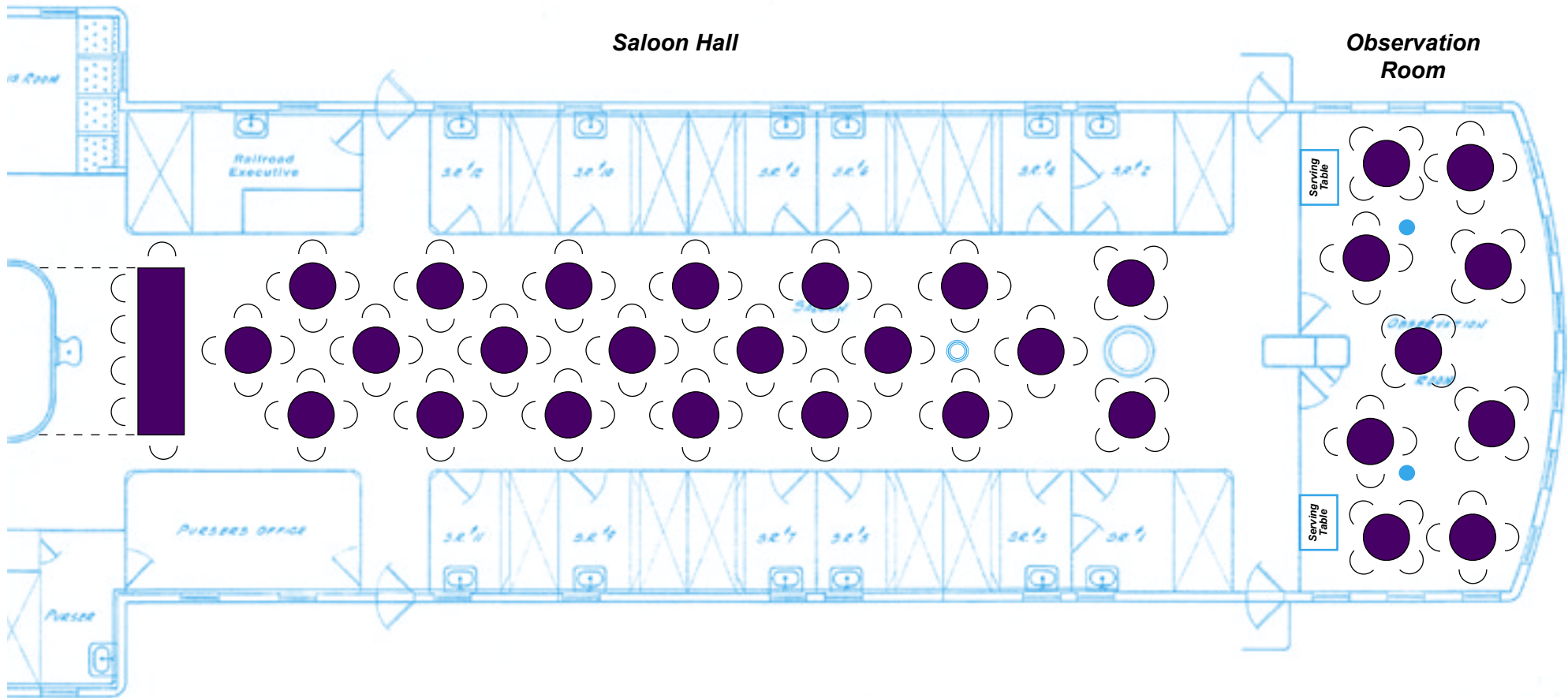


# Passenger Saloon: Formal Seating Plan

**Saloon Hall: 50 persons**  
**Observation Room: 21 persons**  
**Total seating: 71 persons**



This is an elegant arrangement that utilizes the long oak trimmed hall to its greatest aesthetic advantage. The plan can accommodate an extravagant centerpiece or ice sculpture and provides for either a head table or stage area... ideal for formal dinners and weddings. Note: Observation Room is somewhat remote from head table area and may restrict some guests' ability to see and hear hall activity.



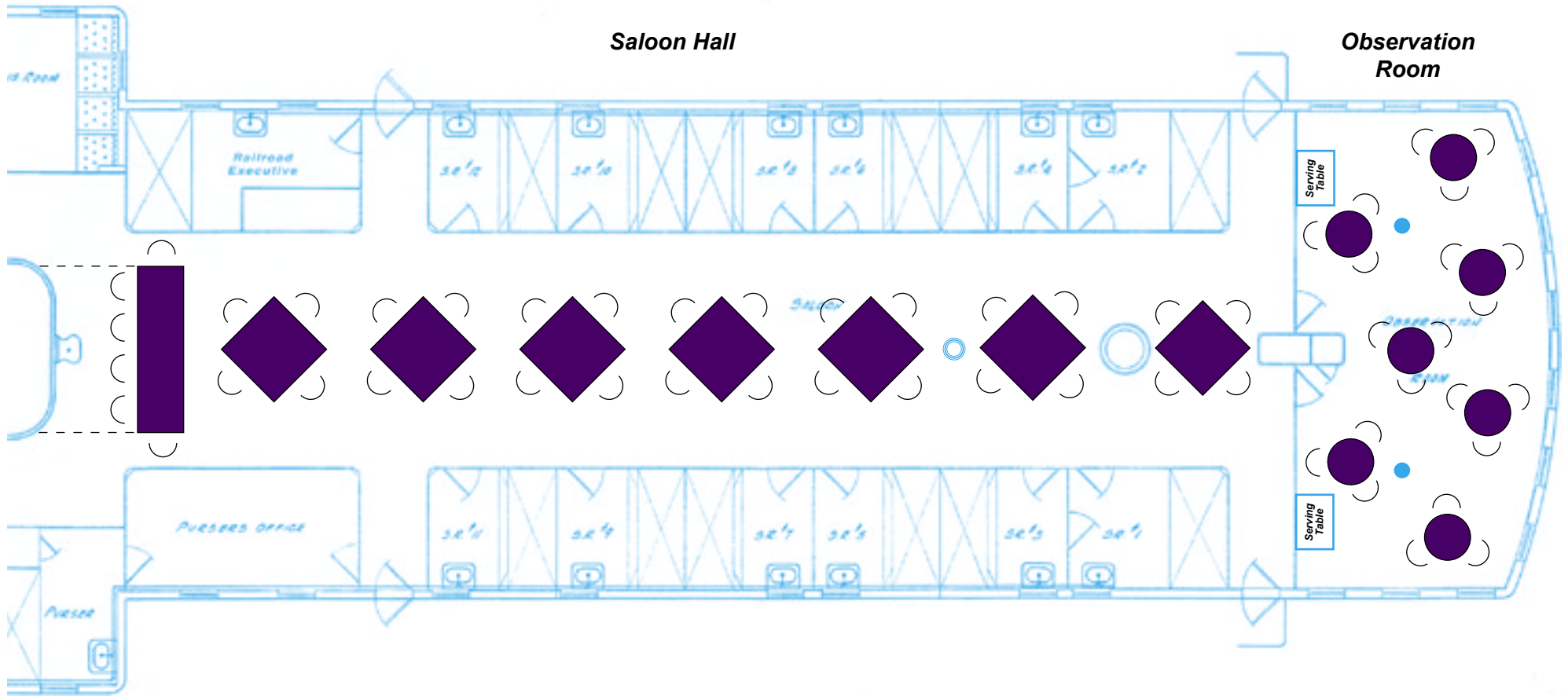
## Passenger Saloon: Club Seating Plan

**Saloon hall: 90 persons**  
**Observation Room: 36 persons**  
**Total seating: 126 persons**

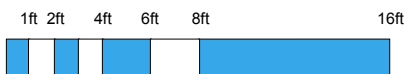
This plan maximizes occupancy in a fun and less formal seating arrangement. A large formal centerpiece or cake can be accommodated with a 'side' table. This plan can also include a traditional head table or stage area in the center or at the end of the hall. Note: Observation Room is somewhat remote from head table area and may restrict some guest's ability to see and hear hall activity.

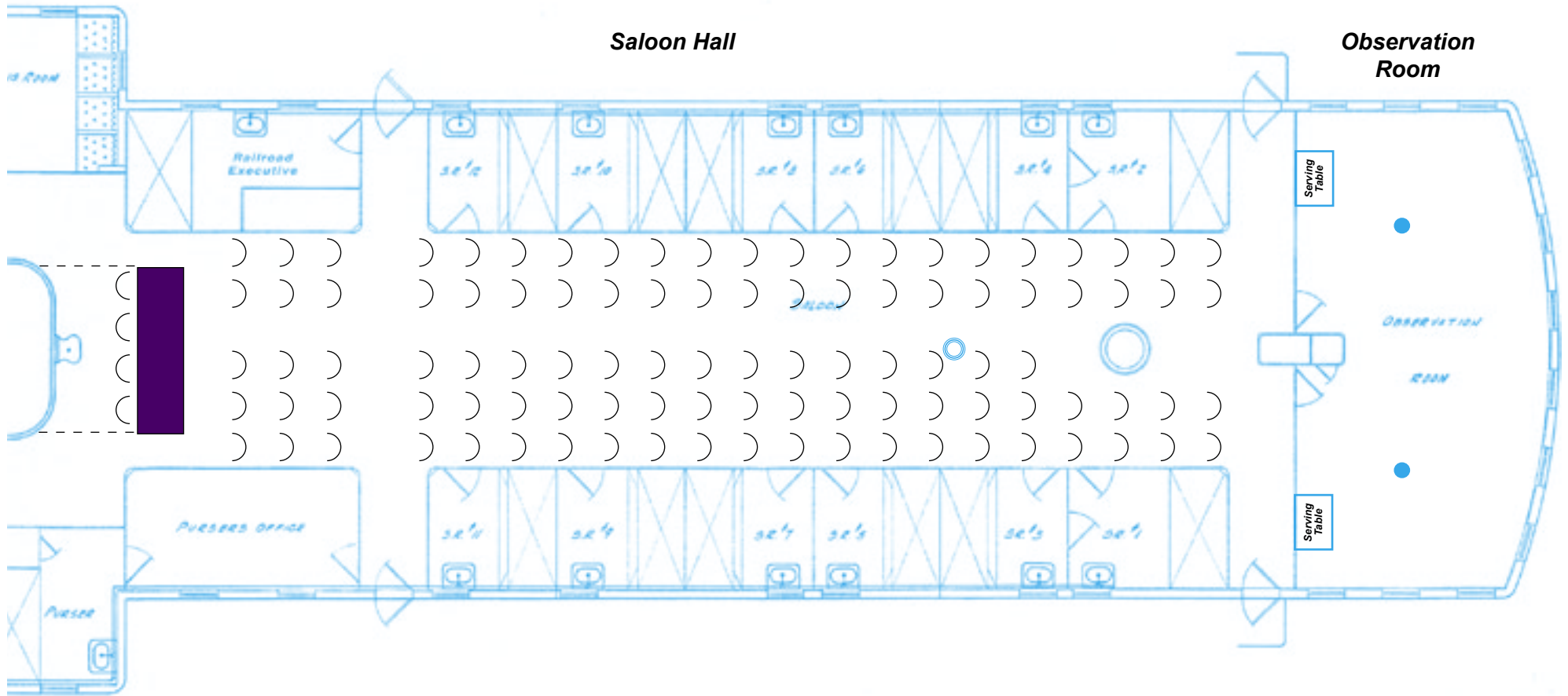


# Passenger Saloon: Diamond Seating Plan

**Saloon Hall: 34 persons**  
**Observation Room: 21 persons**  
**Total seating: 55 persons**

This is an arrangement that can present itself as formal or informal, this plan maximizes table area for gracious dining with individual table centerpieces. Can be arranged with a traditional head table or stage area. Note: Observation Room is somewhat remote from head table area and may restrict some guests' ability to see and hear hall activity.

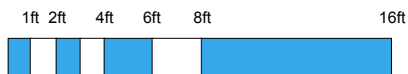


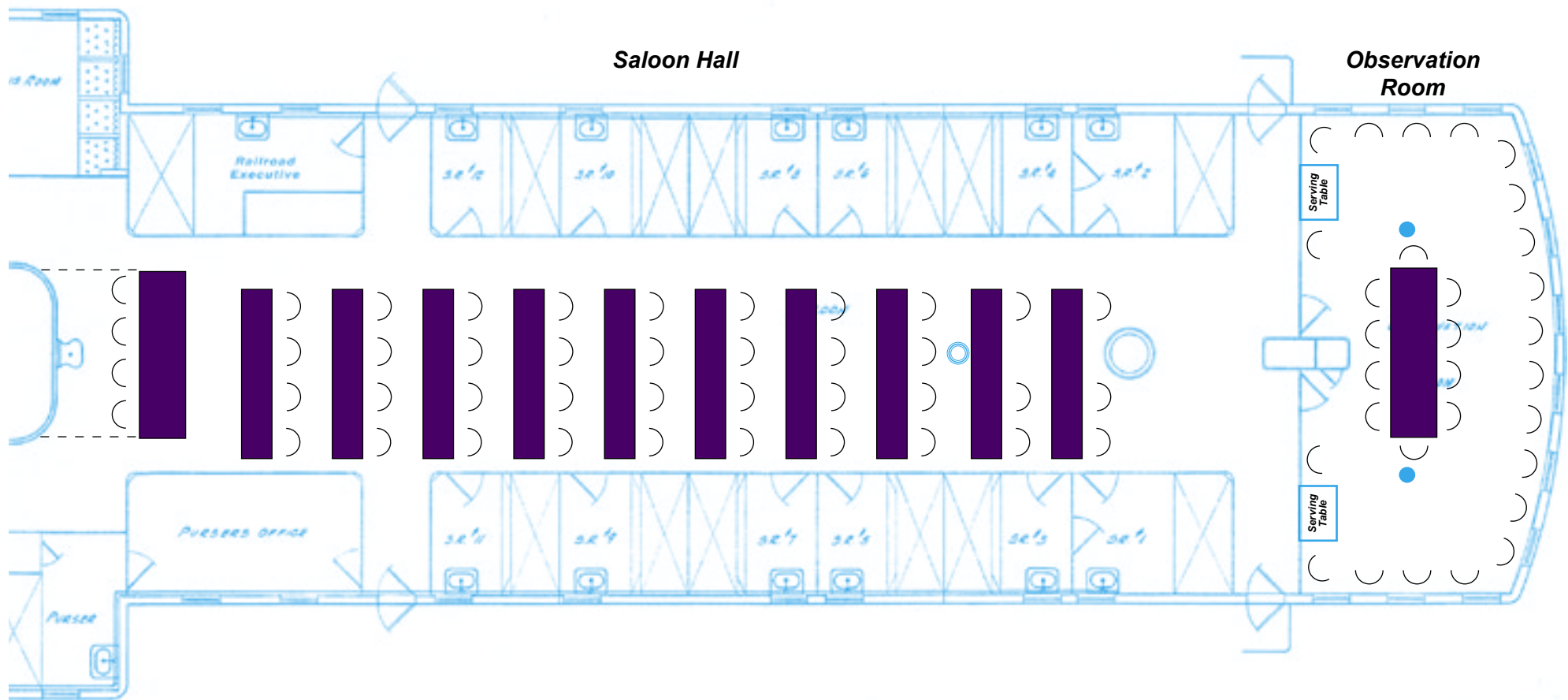


# Passenger Saloon: Program Seating Plan

**Total seating: 101 persons**

This plan provides for maximum occupancy and works well for wedding ceremonies, audio visual programs and lectures where a writing surface is not required. The Passenger Dining Room, Observation Room and outside deck areas work well for a reception or afterglow.



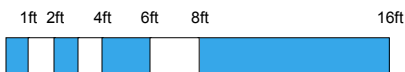


## Passenger Saloon: Conference Seating Plan

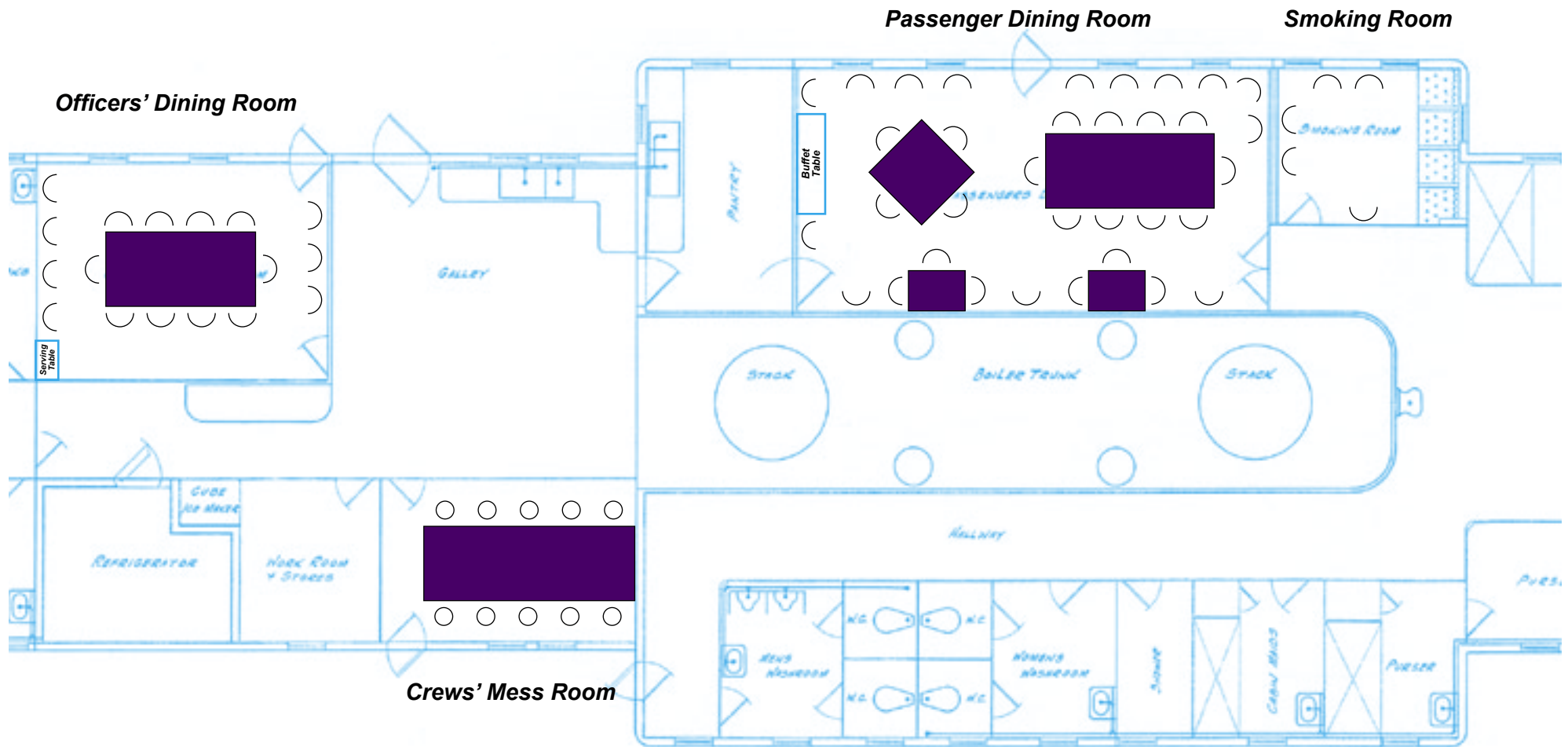
**Saloon hall: 38 persons**

**Observation Room: 30 persons**

**Total seating: 68 persons**



This arrangement of narrow conference tables allows for note taking or snacking during presentations. Plan works well for audio-visual presentations and business workshops or retreats where the entire group needs to gather before or after breakout sessions. The Observation Room, Dining Rooms, Smoking Room and Flicker work well in conjunction with this plan for breakout sessions, workshop or conference areas. Limited meal service can be provided with this plan, but it is not recommended for full service. Generally a conference lunch buffet is set up in the passenger dining room and seating is provided out on deck.



# Dining Rooms: Conference Seating Plan

- Officers' Dining Room: 17 persons**
- Crews' Mess Room: 10 persons**
- Passenger Dining Room: 34 persons**
- Smoking Room: 9 persons**
- Total seating: 70 persons**

Numerous spaces aboard the ship lend themselves well to small meetings, breakout sessions, or workshops. Parties including children's birthdays, receptions etc. can also be hosted in these spaces. Flip charts, writing boards and audiovisual equipment work well in these areas and are available on-board.
